Steed Vernyl Davidson is associate professor of Hebrew Bible/ Old Testament at McCormick Theological Seminary in Chicago. A native of Trinidad and Tobago, he earned a PhD in Hebrew Bible from Union Theological Seminary in New York, an STM from Boston University and both MA and BA from the University of the West Indies.

His work centers on deploying postcolonial theory as a means of interrogating aspects of power in the Bible, biblical interpretation, and use of Scriptures in contemporary cultures. He is the author of *Empire and Exile: Postcolonial Readings of the Book of Jeremiah* (2011) and the co-editor of *Islands, Islanders, and the Bible: RumiNations* (2015). Davidson’s current research focuses on the oracles against the nations in the Prophetic Books in light of contemporary challenges of the nation-state.

Dr. Davidson was an ordained minister in the Methodist Church in the Caribbean and the Americas before becoming an elder in the United Methodist Church (USA). He served churches in St. Vincent, his native Tobago, as well as in the New York Annual Conference of the UMC in Manhattan and Long Island.
